## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION ON OUR NOMINAL ROLL

The Nominal Roll (NR) should include all students attending provincial, independent (private) or band schools who meet all of the requirements listed below.

## STATUS, RESIDENCY, AGE, and ENROLMENT

1.	<b><u>STATUS</u></b> – the student must be Indian or Inuit (as defined in the Indian Act).
•	a registered Indian or an Indian not yet registered, but whose parent is registered; an unregistered Indian whose parent could be, but is not registered;
•	an unregistered Indian who is in the process of reinstatement;
•	an Inuit; (The above conditions are verified by comparison to the Indian Register.) The EXCEPTION to
•	this rule is: a non-Indian whose residence is on-reserve, but not on leased land.

2. **<u>RESIDENCE</u>** – the student must live on a reserve. Students are to be included on the Nominal Roll of the reserve in which they currently reside. This includes:

• A student whose home is located on a reserve. A home is a <u>civic address</u> where a student is living and has NO home elsewhere.

• Students placed temporarily in approved student accommodation in order to attend school.

• <u>Non-Native</u> students living on commercially leased land are not entitled to be on our NR.

- Status Students living on Certificate of Possession, buckshee (not registered), or
- commercially leased land are eligible to be registered on our NR.
- 3. <u>AGE</u> the student must be at least four (4) years of age by December  $31^{st}$  of the current year.
- Unregistered persons 18 years of age or older, as of June 30<sup>th</sup> of the current year are not eligible to be included on the nominal roll.

4.	<b><u>ENROLLMENT</u></b> – the student must be attending an approved elementary or secondary school
	by <b>September 30<sup>th</sup></b> of the current year.

5. <u>ADULT PROGRAM</u> – students must be enrolled in a planned program of studies that meets the adult elementary / secondary curriculum standards and funding requirements of the Ministry of Education, Skills and Training and grants a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Certificate).
