I challenged Sc/f though the Human Rights Tribunal, when they took 3 of my foster children away and put them in a white home, I won that case and got them back but I am happy to say that they are now with their mother. I will advocate for all children who were taken away from families and communities. We have suffered enough though Residential Schools and this has got to stop.

I actively participated at the Mt. Polly protest camp for a few days- as a support for environment concerns about the Mt Polly mine disaster of clean-up of the spill.

I have attended meetings and gatherings concerning the environment. I still do a lot of public relations when requested to do openings plus closings e.g. Kamloops City Inaugural, The Missing & Murdered Woman Vigils, Take Back the Night, First Nations Technology Council, and many more.

I respect and participate in traditional ceremonies, volunteer and support for many social functions, such as gatherings, funerals, and continue to visit local schools, I do a lot of local, regional and international public relations.
