This years Little Fawn Nursery numbers are 26 children throughout the center. As of January 2020 we now have 12 enrolled in the Infant/Toddler Room, 7 in the 3-5 Room, and 7 enrolled in the pre-K-4 program.

High Priority: Secwepemc Language Revitalization

Since 2010, the TteS started the Secwepemc Language immersion Program – the children spend the day learning and using the Secwepemc Language. Our Language teachers use a variety of teaching strategies. Through experiential activities, the children are given an opportunity to hear and learn the language as much as possible.

The immersion Program is based on child-centered curriculum based on a wide variety of themes and topics.

- 2 Programs took place in 2019
- 25 students took upgrading

- 13 completed their upgrading with 5 returning in 2020

Indigenous Tourism Program April – August 2019

- 9 students registered
- 9 students were Band and Community members
- 8 completed the program with 6 doing work practicums
 Note: 4 students did work practicums at the Museum for experience and to assist with staffing

- Beginner training took place for Band and Community Members, focusing on elders. Day and evening classes were provided
- 11 people took the training with 10 completing
- Excel Training was offered to 9 staff and Band/Community members
- 6 completed the training
