Annual Tax Cycle 2023

Assessment Process

Tkemlúps te Secwépemc (TteS) has an assessment TteS Chief & Council (C&C) must pass "annual services agreement with the BC Assessment Authority (BCA). BCA assesses the value of all taxable properties on the "valuation date" of July 1, and the "physical condition" date of October 31, which may impact the final value in the Assessment Notice. BCA issues the Assessment Notices to taxpayers by December 31.

If you disagree with your assessment here are two appeals options available that must be submitted to BCA:

- Reconsideration of Assessment:
 - due Jan 31st and no fee
- Assessment Appeal:
 - due March 1st and \$30.00 fee

Property Taxation & Assessment Laws

The Tkemlúps te Secwépemc Property Taxation Law, 2023 and the Tkemlúps te Secwépemc Property Assessment Law, 2023, were approved by FNTC on June 15, 2023, and came into force on June 16, 2023.

Taxpayer Representation to Council Law

The intent of the Law is to provide taxpayers with opportunities for input into property taxation matters, proposed local revenue laws, representations to Council and communications between Council & taxpayers at the annual tax meeting. The Law is being updated to the 2023 version of

Cannabis Law

The Council passed the *Tkemlups te Secwépemc* Cannabis Law, 2022. The law has been published on the First Nations Gazette.

Tkemlups te Secwépemc Home Owner Grant (HOG)

The HOG is considered a form of payment and penalties are applied on late grant applications. If you are eligible, the HOG must be filled out in full. signed and returned to our office prior to the tax due date each year, even if you are on the prepayment plan. The HOG can be found on the back of your tax notice. On your 2023 Property Taxation Notice you will find a website address to login into

e-HOG. You will also be provided with a unique Assessment ID and access key to log in with on your notice.

2023 Information on Applying: For security purposes you are only allowed to use this online function if you have applied/approved for a Owner or Additional Grant in the previous year.





Annual Tax Budget
















Planning & Engineering Update

CAPITAL WORKS 2023

Bus Stops — Three covered bus shelters have been installed along TteS IR#1 bus route. Five benches and one additional covered shelter will be completed in 2023.

EV Charging Stations — 10 electric vehicle charging stations have been installed at Tk'emlups Petro Canada.

Salish Multi-Use Path — A 1.8 m wide separated walking/cycling path was constructed along Salish Road.

East Shuswap Multi-Use Path — A 1.0 km long section of separated walking/cycling path will be constructed along East Shuswap Road. Connecting the Sienna Ridge development to the CLC area.

Kootenay Way Upgrades — Construction of a 600 m watermain extension and two lane paved road upgrade was completed in 2022. Benefitting Area lands total 60 hectares (150 acres).

CLC Roundabout — A modern roundabout, road realignment, and Hwy #5 intersection storage/ turning lane upgrades will support commercial development in the CLC area, residential development at Sun Rivers, and improve traffic flows to established businesses.

BYLAWS

False Alarm Bylaw — New penalties fare in place for activation of an alarm system which results in a police response which is determined to be a result of a false alarm.

Trespass Bylaw — Accessing lands outside paved public roadways within TteS IR#1 lands is considered trespassing until TteS completes a Recreational Facilities Plan.

Water Bylaw — Water restrictions are in effect from May 1st to August 31st.

No sprinkling or irrigating between 11 am and 6 pm on any day.

Even addresses can sprinkle only on even days. Odd addresses can sprinkle only on odd days.

Dog Licensing — All dogs are required to be licenced yearly at TteS Bylaw Office. Microchip, vaccinate, and identify your pets with a collar or tag. Spay/Neuter your pets. Ensure your dog is kept safe and secured and confined within your property.
