

- A student who turns four years old by December 31st (please provide a copy of the Birth Certificate).
- A student holding a status Card.
- A student residing on-Reserve (a utility bill must be provided by the parent).
- A student "in care" who would conventionally reside On-Reserve.
- A student enrolled by September 30th (a parental form must be completed).

My goal is to walk alongside our young people as we explore our strengths, overcome barriers, and build futures that reflect set career aspirations as well as our Secwépemc ways of knowing and being. With a background riddled in youth engagement, program development and participation and as a long-time student myself, I believe youth thrive in environments that provide access to mentorship, cultural grounding and hands-on experiences in education, trades and employment! So, let's get down to business! Come pop in my office, anytime or reach out via phone or email, and we can get you rollin' on your progressive educational and employment pathway(s)!

In the months ahead, I'll be focusing on:

- Strengthening partnerships that open doors and opportunities for youth in trades, training, and education.
- Building mentorship opportunities that connect our young people with Elders, knowledge keepers and industry partners in their fields of interest.
- · Listening to youth directly understanding their needs, interests and aspirations so that programs can truly reflect our voice.

I am sincerely stoked to meet with many of you at upcoming community events, and I welcome your ideas, feedback, and partnership in creating a culturally celebratory and welcoming environment that supports our TteS youth. #### **Trades & Training**


Last year, the adult upgrading program had two staff members complete their Adult Dogwood. Classes are available evenings for staff.

Start your apprenticeship training as a carpenter. Level One will be offered this January at TteS. A great program for those with some carpentry experience and wanting to get paid tradesperson wages.

A construction trade sampler took place from February to May 2025. This was in partnership with TRU and Infrastructure BC. 10 participants completed the training and worked on a renovation project at Spiyu7ullucw Ranch to renovate one of the old ranch houses. All ten students are moving on to apprenticeships in electrical and carpentry this fall. Work placements are being coordinated with the construction company EllisDon to work on the BC

















#### Top Dog Hot Dog Cart was a Success!

The Top Dog Hot Dog Cart rocked it this year! Our coordinator and youth attended 28 events over the summer and raised \$2800 towards bursaries and scholarships for band members. This was a youth program to teach customer services and essential skills. We had four great youth who were employed and helped over the summer.
