

A recent press release went out stating that the Secwépemc Nation opposes any consultation with Metis Groups within Secwepemcúlecw, further that their homeland does not overlap with Secwepemcúlecw, upholding our Title and Rights. Columbia River Treaty Historical Commitment of Agreement in Principal has a negotiating team working with 5 governments (Ktunaka, Syilx, Secwépemc, Provincial and Federal Government) along with the United States to modernize a very complex treaty. It is recognized as the first jointly negotiated international treaty in Canada that includes many interests and concerns such as flood risk management, environmental impacts, salmon restoration, socio-economics and climate change while providing reliable power. These nation initiatives are to strengthen relationships and establishing unity with whole Nation.




