

Position Overview

GeoVerra is seeking a new team member **from the Stk'emlupsemc te Secwepemc Nation (SSN)** to represent both SSN and GeoVerra on Pipsell (Jacko) Lake and Spread 5A of the Trans Mountain Expansion Project, based in **Kamloops, BC**. The successful candidate will be working in an Indigenous Monitor role as a GeoVerra employee representing SSN's interests and values. This position will work in the field daily; monitoring and reporting for the Trans Mountain and SSN.

Key Responsibilities

- Support a positive and professional team atmosphere and act as a positive ambassador for the company and the SSN Nation in all situations where there is contact with the public, our clients or potential clients and project contractors;
- Monitor the implementation of mitigation measures specifically intended to minimize TLU/TMRU and cultural/heritage impacts.
- Support chance-find identification of environmental resources and archaeological sensitivities that have indigenous cultural and heritage values
- Review permitting documents, monitor construction activities, and report on findings each day;
- Participate in environmental sampling and other environmental inspection duties, as directed, which may include:
 - Inspection and tracking of equipment cleaning
 - Marking of environmentally sensitive sites (e.g., riparian areas, watercourses, rare plant sites, and wildlife areas (trails, mineral licks, dens, nests, lodges)
 - Work with wildlife salvage crews regarding certain species at risk prior to clearing and grading;
 - Assessing pre-construction conditions of watercourse crossings, wetlands and riparian areas; and
 - Other duties as directed and as qualified to perform.
- Attend daily safety meetings.

Required Skills and Behaviours

- Knowledge and experience performing Traditional Land Use Understanding of and ability to provide expertise on requirements as outlined in the Indigenous Monitor Contractor Qualification Specification form;
- Knowledge of applied sciences in any of the following areas considered an asset:
 - Archaeology, aquatic systems, describing ecosystems in the field, soils and landforms, vegetation and plant identification, wildlife, resource and/or land management
- Safety certifications considered an asset:
 - Standard first aid, H2S training, PCST/CSTS, UTV
- Valid driver's license and clear driver abstract;
- Ability to use an iPad, cell phone and other specified devices;
- Ability to work a flexible schedule to accommodate the construction schedule (e.g., up to 12 hours per day and possible shift rotation of 14 days on / 7 days off or 6 days on / 1 day off or 10 days on 4 days off);
- Equipped to work in all types of weather conditions;

- Wage is set at \$27.70/hr
- Comprehensive health and dental benefits package offered
- Construction shifts up to 12 hours per day and possible shift rotation of 14 days on / 7 days off or 6 days on / 1 day off or 10 days on 4 days off)
 - Position eligible for overtime which is paid in accordance with provincial employment standards
- Position is anticipated to end December 2022 with a possibility of extension.
