- Will be meeting with SCFSA Director Yvonne Hare Feb 1, 2023.
- Working on a process of acquiring a Bus, Truck, and a couple Side by Sides.
 Application to be sent to ISC Jordon's Principal Capital Funding.
- Child, Youth and Family gatherings are in process.
- Team Lead Tatiana has worked on updating all Job Descriptions within her Family Support Team

5. INDIAN REGISRTY ADMINISTRATOR

- Working on "Formal Wills" workshop with Indigenous Service Canada to be held in TteS, however the Federal Government staff are still not travelling out of office. TteS will be on the wait list to have ISC IRA come out to do any presentations to community.
- New kits and/or booklets are being sent out to Denise which she can distribute to community.
- Denise is working on Elder's luncheons with the help of all CS Staff
- Registering Elder's for National Elder's Gathering in Edmonton, AB fall of 2023
- Registering Elder's for BC Elder's Gathering the summer of 2023

- Day to day activities on Status Card applications/ reports on births, deaths, marriages.
- Working with Anne Keith on Membership Code Job Description
- Finalizing Business Case and Job Description for Membership Code Worker

6. JUSTICE:

- New Justice Worker Tayler Perry has just started and hit the ground running, lots of knowledge and experience in working with the Law Enforcement. Tayler will be involved in the signing of the MOU that Shannon and I have been working on.
- We are looking forward to her input on the MOU with Justice BC

7. MENTAL HEALTH NAVIGATOR

- Interviews were held for Mental Health Navigator position and an offer will be going out as soon as the HR Assistant is back from Leave.
- There are many requests for Mental Health supports, which are referred out to other MH resources in Kamloops.

8. SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT/FUNERAL WORKER

- A bulk order of appliances for clients and Elders was ordered. (Washers, Dryers, Fridges and Stoves) The eligibility list went back to March 2021 and further clients that aged out.
- There was a surplus of funds that ISC had provided for clients during COVID. Now the surplus is being utilized to purchase appliances for the clients.
- Winterswan has also assumed the Funeral Services Worker position alongside her Band Social Development Worker. Along side this role she is also on-call, for emergencies within those 2 departments.

9. **STSMEMELT**

- Stsmemelt Coordinator Veronica Seymour continues to attend the monthly Stsmemelt Meetings that are held in various Nations on rotating basis.
- Cultural Enrichment Worker Steve Basil is also attending the monthly meetings with Veronica.
- The Stsmemelt Technical Working Group is continuing to work on the Secwepemc Laws and Cultural protocols as they pertain to Stsmemelt.
- A Workshop will be held on January 26th to start discussions on the creation of Stsmemelt Laws. Bonnie Leonard, who is working on the Laws alongside U of Vic Students will be in attendance to present what C-92 is about to community.
- There will be several community engagements to discuss the Stsmemelt.
 Community is required to have they're in-put and to further develop working groups.

• The Stsmemelt Technical Working Group was given 5 years to work on the process and we are on year 3. Next year 2024, the Coordination Agreement will have to be signed which will kick in the time clock of 1 year to assume the Stsmemelt Laws, programs and services.

10. SPORTS AND RECREATION

- Anne Keith Sports and Recreations Coordinator is very busy ensuring the ongoing activities of her department are going on. Managing the daily activities of the Youth Workers.
- YOUTH WORKERS: The Youth Centre is now open to after school programming. 2 additional Youth Workers were hired to work on the after-school program. Since the programs have started with Youth, everyday new youth are joining.
- Anne is involved in the NAIG and Memorial Cup planning.
- She has several projects on the go ie: Food Sovereignty, community events, etc

11. WELLNES COORDINATOR

- Interviews were held for Wellness Coordinator position and an offer will be going out as soon as the HR Assistant is back from Leave.
- This is another area that is much need in the community. Many people dealing with grief and loss, Mental Health issues, Drugs and Alcohol, etc.

12. PROPOSALS

• Trauma Informed Funding Proposal was submitted for 100,000.00

Education:

- Working on 2024 fiscal budgets and business cases
- Working with TRU to offer and develop a PhD program with a focus on Indigenous trauma; in the meantime, we are currently developing a grad certificate in Counselling in Indigenous Trauma and an Indigenous cohort. This program will enable us to certify more Indigenous counsellors to assist with the opiate crisis and provide wellness supports for our people with finding the Le Estcwicwéy. This grad certificate program will run September 2023
- Utilizing external funding to conduct a feasibility study for the Education Centre; met with Vision Quest regarding the document and worked with P&E Department to ensure we receive a usable document.
- Respectfully requesting an update on the attached business case that was submitted and presented on November 1/2022. The FAC approved of the business case on Nov 1/2022 and one Councillor voted against C&C motion on Nov.15/2022. Would like to request that C&C review it again and provide a motion of decision next week. During the

FAC presentation, the Education Dept. confirmed that we were going to develop a policy around the program. We have received \$14k for policy development from FNESC, and we will use these funds for a policy around K-12 Funding Supports, inclusive of technology, sports academies and extra curricular activities as they pertain to a school environment. As such, this business case is not relevant to Elite Athletes, and it is different from Community Services Recreation funds.

 Hoping to give Edu Dept. Portfolio Holders preliminary budget presentation on the departments next fiscal year budget on Friday, Jan.27. Reviewing the budgets prior to seeing it initially at the FAC could address concerns, inquiries or questions beforehand and expediate the FAC review process.

Sk'elep School Update:

- Working on FY23-24 proposed budgets.
- Our Winter Feast was well attended and enjoyed by students, staff and parents it was a great turnout!

Housing Update:

- 1. Kamloopa Way Townhomes and Apartment (BC Housing)
 - We are currently struggling with the land designation from ISC. TteS Lands department has helped and arranged a meeting with ISC to address this concern (next week or two)
 - We are currently talking with BC Housing/Lands/Lawyer to address this and try and find a solution
 - 1 & 2 Bedroom 30 Unit Apartment Building. 28 3- & 4-Bedroom Townhomes
 - We have submitted 50% drawings to BC Housing for Civil, Mechanical and Electrical review.
 - BC Housing has recently come back and are in the process of addressing some questions with the architect
 - Once this is addressed, we will provide drawings to A&T Construction to get us preliminary pricing
 - Once approved from BC Housing, we can submit for funding to get drawings to 100%
- 2. West Shuswap Road Section 95 Rent-To-Own (CMHC)
 - This is an 11-home subdivision, with 4 homes being built this year
 - The intention is to have 3 or 4 homes approved through CMHC every year or two
 - Subdivision Civil Works Contract Signed and Acres to Start Early March or Earlier Depending on Weather

Update on 4 homes currently:

Lot # 1 (Plan GB-135)

- No change. Excavation will have to wait until spring.
- We'd need to import too much dirt and backfill/compact.
- Frozen ground. Would require hoarding and heating. Not cost effective.

Lot# 2 (Plan GB-161)

- o Footings & frost walls poured and passed inspection
- Backfill and compaction complete
- First floor framing and floor system installed
- Second floor framing complete. Sheathing complete.
- Trusses scheduled for Jan 6th.
- Paper and shingle roof (mid-January)

- Windows and door packages ordered. Lead time is 4-5 weeks.
- Trusses installed

Lot # 10 (Plan GB-135)

Lot # 11 (Plan GB-161)

- EXP to inspect compaction Monday/Tuesday of next week
- Next steps: Hoarding, heating then plumbing under-slab rough-in and pour slab on grade foundation.

- Compaction test passed
- First floor framing near completion
- o Floor joists ready for install (Jan 16th/17th)
- o Hoarding, heating then plumbing under-slab rough in
- 3. We are currently applying for NHCF Repair Opportunity
 - In an effort to make our funding programs more accessible, we have been able to provide TteS with an Offer Letter to carry out on-reserve repairs for up to 22 homes. This grant is intended to be paired with other capital (specifically Health and Safety or other funding from ISC). CMHC will only contribute up to 40% of the total repair cost or up to \$15,000 per home. For example, a home that receives \$15,000 (40%) in funding from CMHC will therefore require an additional \$22,500 (60%) in funding from ISC or any other source(s). (Deadline Jan 31st)
- 4. TteS Emergency Shelter for Indigenous Women and Children Fleeing Violence (CMHC)
 - We completed and submitted our application a couple months ago
 - We were notified over the Christmas Break that unfortunately we were not successful. However, our application was extremely strong, and they have put us on a waitlist.
 - We responded and addressed some of CMHC concerns and requested it to be looked at again.
 - They came back this week and let us know, "CMHC is hopeful that we will eventually be able to fund projects on the waiting list. However, we likely will have to wait until 2024 to see how much funding is remaining in the program and what demographic targets have been achieved"
- TteS Supportive Housing for Indigenous People Experiencing Homelessness, Mental Illness and/or Addiction (BC Housing)
 - We have a preliminary proposal developed with BC Housing
 - However, there is currently a lack of funding to move forward with this project currently
 - We are in constant contact with BC Housing regarding this, and have been assured that once funding is available this project will be revisited with TteS
- 6 Federal Rapid Housing Initiative 3 (CMHC)
 - a. We have our application almost ready to submit (Deadline Mid-March)
 - b. We are proposing three duplexes of 2-bedroom units
 - c. This will mirror what was constructed for the Tyee Elders Units and in the same location

- Revelstoke Caribou Complex Technical Working Group
 - The Group met to discuss the presentation materials that may be utilized to brief Community leadership on the Revelstoke recovery options being prepared by the working group. Discussions were also had regarding the translocation of caribou, and concerns about participating in the translocation leading to extirpation and infringement are being reviewed by the Indigenous participants.
- First Nations BC Wildlife & Habitat Stewardship Forum

- Wildlife Branch received approval for the engagement approach to review the wildlife act, and content development for the discussion paper will occur February 8th and 9th.
- The Ministry of Agriculture has begun work planning for their policy review required to move a Domestic-Wild Sheep Separation Policy Program and has executive support to coordinate.
- FCRSA expirations: BC has committed to replacing the FCRSA program by Fiscal Year end 2023-24 and is asking communities to sign one final extension agreement. To support this request, communities requested a briefing note on BC's commitments to the path forward and inclusion of the QS.
- The working group also actioned development of draft 'preamble' language (i.e. mutual commitment to co-develop, shared objectives, etc.) for discussion at the next meeting, and presentation at the March 8 CFAN Table meeting.
