Job Summary:

Lii Michif Otipemisiwak Family & Community Services (LMO) is currently seeking a qualified and energetic a Casual Early Childhood Assistant to join our Michif Early Years Team to provide as needed support and programming to children ages 0-12 in our newly established Michif Early Years Learning Centre, as well as other Early Years Programming. As a member of our Michif Early Years Team, the Casual Michif Early Childhood Program Assistant will work collaboratively with our Michif Early Years Team to facilitate and coordinate resources, guests and activities for multiple Métis specific programs aimed as supporting the developmental needs of children and their guardians. In keeping with all services offered at LMO, the Michif Early Childhood Program Assistant will deliver services in a manner consistent with the Society's Vision and utilizing culturally safe and trauma informed practices.

Specific Responsibilities:

- Support and work collaboratively with our Michif Early Years Learning Centre Team to facilitate culturally safe and trauma informed strategies, activities & programs for children and their guardians that reflect Métis cultural teachings and practices to promote positive social, emotional, physical and mental development of children ages 0-12
- Assist team with the delivery of programs and services as needed
- Engage with children and guardians to offer support and guidance during programming
- Actively participate in children's activities and programs
- Support and model healthy attachments and development milestones
- Prepare resources, documents, learning tools and reports as required

Qualifications & Job Requirements:

- Completion of a degree or 2-year diploma in Early Childhood Development or equivalent
- Minimum of 2 years' experience in ECD, AIDP, or ASCD related work
- Minimum of 2 years' experience in program development and organization
- Strong knowledge of child development, attachment theories and possess relevant experience working in an inclusive childcare setting
- Experience supporting children with trauma, autism, alcohol related neurological disorders and attachment challenges
- Knowledge of family centered practice, demonstrate positive child-adult interactions & ensure agency Mission Statement, philosophies, policies and procedures are upheld.
- Cultural sensitivity and knowledge of Metis history and values

- The ability to maintain a positive, professional, non-judgmental attitude and the ability to maintain confidentiality
- The ability to work independently and as a collaborative team member
- Must successfully complete a criminal record check.
- Must hold a valid BC driver's license and possess a reliable means of transportation. Class 4 Unrestricted License an asset.
- Valid child specific First Aid/CPR, or equivalent to meet licensing standards.
