- Assisted Finance with Address Updates Ahead of Cheque Distribution: We collaborated
  with the Finance team to update member addresses in preparation for the Christmas
  cheque distribution. Employing a multi-channel approach, we utilized social media,
  emails, the TteS app, and direct calls to ensure accurate and timely updates from our
  members.
- Event Coordination: This week involved the successful coordination of various events, including Remembrance Day, Indigenous Veterans Day, TteS AGM, CER Meeting, Training and Employment Needs Dinner, and A Night of Songs and Stories. We received lots of positive feedback from those who attended, although it's still a challenge to get members out to these events. Members continue to emphasize that events need to start later on weekdays and should be on weekends more often.
- Promotion of Stswékstem Engineered Waste Management Facility: We collaborated
  with KIBDC to promote the soft opening of the Stswékstem Engineered Waste
  Management Facility. Utilizing social media, posters, and newsletters, we implemented
  a comprehensive strategy to enhance awareness and promote the facility's use by both
  members and the public.

## **Language & Culture Update**:

- Completed revision -TteS EC Dev Film Policy to LC dept Film Policy- A. C&C adopted the amendment to the policy. B. We will consult with Travis and Tammy about an interdepartmental financial transfer.
- 2. Working with Nicole and Splash-museum website-nearly complete
- 3. Cultural video with Deina, Gabe, Lyle and CFJC- 2 videos complete-wkg on historical timeline. Timeline nearly complete.

- 4. C&C reps and I met with Dr Sarar Nickel, UA professor for field school in Kamloops-partner TteS/TRU-BN needed to determine the focus of research project. I sent a BN to request Dr. Sarah Nickle and her group of field school students to conduct research and write the history of TteS. Many other nations and communities have completed this work, but not TteS. **No update -C&C**
- 5. I attend the 13-grassroots family advisory comm meetings and am part of the community department manager group Dan George facilitator.
- 6. Tkek Yeel Stem program complete- I'm working with Arnold to complete infrastructure upgrades, and we need a bus.
- 7. Parks Canada \$25K -LE/LC Ambassadors program is complete. I will submit all invoices and receipts. We are shooting a video of Jackie doing KIRS tour-teaching tool and will develop a teachers guide to accompany video.
- Gabe and Ethan are teaching staff Secwepemctsin classes and traditional songs. Staff in four or five dept are enrolled in learning the language. -CoK wants language lessons as well.
- 9. In partnership with SIB, Dr. Maryanne Ignace is hosting the SFU language proficiency program in our LC classroom. 18 students enrolled, now 13, most are TteS members/staff-classes M-Tu until June 2024.
- 10. Wumecwilc re Secwepemctsin western dialect fluent speakers group who meet September-June.
- 11. FPCC funding approved for the Silent speakers 'program -survivors who lost their language while attending KIRS —This program started at the beginning of September with Ted Gottfriedson Jr. as the instructor, Hilda Green as the cognitive therapist, who will help us remember the language we lost while attending the KIRS- 4 TteS members 2 non band members.
- 12. FPCC funding approved for \$198K for museum renovations. Elsie Joe, curator, and Arnold John are overseeing this project.
- 13. Graveyard -working with P&E-hired contract workers-need to meet to plan next steps. Brent Kriese worked August Oct. removed weeds and cacti from the graveyard. John recoded invoices PO for the equipment needed. John and I developed a JD for the graveyard/church caretaker.
- 14. Gabe, Diena, Nicole and Kathleen Elkins planned the annual Language conference two weeks ago. Conference a success but we will be doing debriefing tomorrow to see where we did well and where we may improve. We plan on Salishan language conference next year.
