Fraud Alert:

Unfortunately Covid-19 hasn't deterred those attempting to defraud people. An old scheme is rearing its ugly head again.

Suspects approach their victims in higher traffic areas (gas stations, grocery store parking lots, etc). The suspects then claim to have lost their wallets and need money for hospital bills or war escaping domestic abuse. There are two versions recently:

- 1. Suspect approaches an individual and offers to sell them gold jewelry. A transaction is completed for the gold and later on the victim determines that the gold jewellery is fake.
- 2. Suspect approaches an individual and asks for money for the same type of reasons as above. The suspect offers gold jewelry to the victim as collateral. Later on, the victim determines the jewelry to be fake and doesn't hear back from the suspect.

Suspects in these type of frauds have generally been foreign nationals, but please be aware of anyone trying this scam when you are out for shopping.
